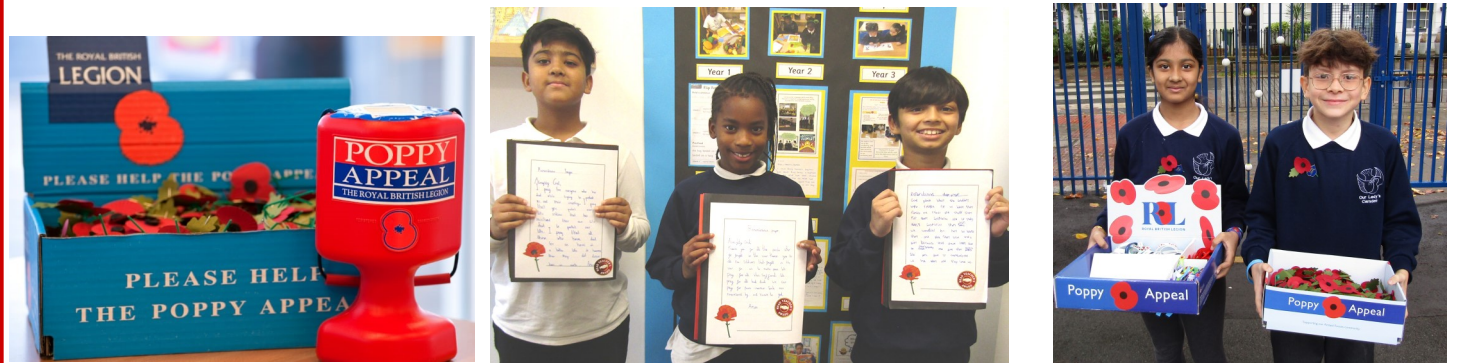
Dear Parents and Carers,

If you or your child are worried about something or have any questions, please phone the school office and book an appointment to see their class teacher, Miss Toop, Miss Fearon or Mr Withers.

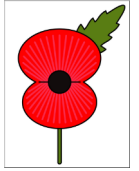


Remembrance Sunday Prayer
