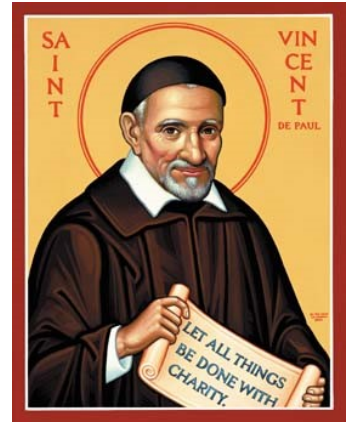
A Prayer for St. Vincent de Paul

Work of the Week!

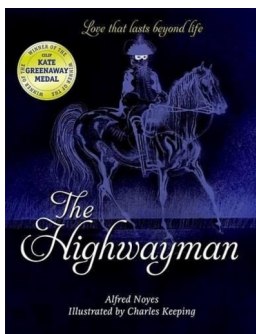
