A visit from New Ways Charity

Fr Denis & Fr Joe from St Joseph's Primary & Nursery in Nariokotome, Kenya visited us this week with Angela Doherty to talk about the positive impact our donations have had on this community. The children of Our Lady's were able to ask Fr Denis questions to learn more about the similarities and differences between the schools.

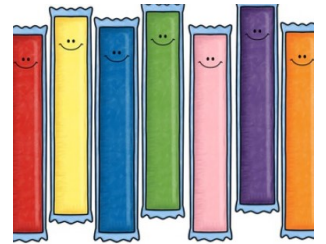
Amelia was a maths magician and was able to enthusiastically count how many cubes she has got left over, to work out how many have been taken away

Well done Amelia, we are so proud of you and your beautiful work!



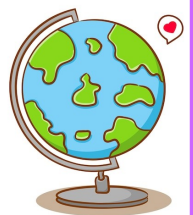
Ice Pop Sale
