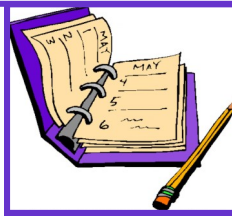

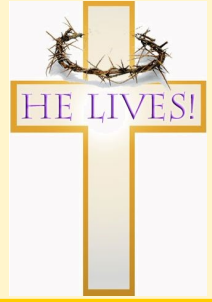

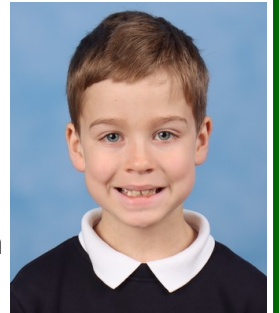
Work of the Week!
