This is our summer term school community event and will be held on **Friday 4th July** 6.00 - 8.00pm. All parents and children are invited and we hope to see you all there.

Tickets will be available from the school office from 3.30pm on Monday 16th June.

£5.00 ADULT TICKET includes admittance, entertainment, one portion of BBQ food (meat or vegetarian), a portion of salad and a soft drink.

£3.00 CHILD TICKET includes admittance, entertainment, one portion of BBQ food (meat or vegetarian), a portion of salad and a soft drink.

Children must be accompanied by an adult who is over 18. Children will not be able to come by themselves.

Children below school age will not have access to the bouncy castle or bouncy slide due to insurance.

Parents can also help by running stalls on the day. Please contact the school office to volunteer.

Events include: DJ and disco, Bouncy castle and bouncy slide - 50p a turn, Face painting - 50p, Tuck shop, soft drinks and Ice pops also available for sale. Raffle tickets will be available at the BBQ - £1 per strip. Prizes include £100 Amazon voucher, £75 Amazon voucher, £50 Amazon voucher, assorted adult and child prize hampers. We look forward to seeing you all there.

In the event of poor weather this event will be cancelled. **No refunds will be given.** Instead a BBQ event will be held for all the children in the school on a sunny afternoon during the summer term.

The children have been learning that our world is a gift from God and we are called as stewards to look after it.

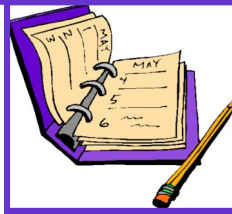

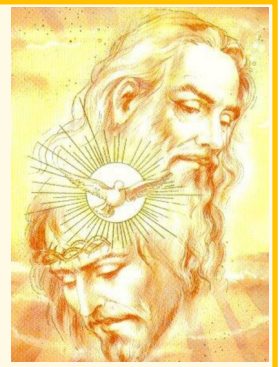

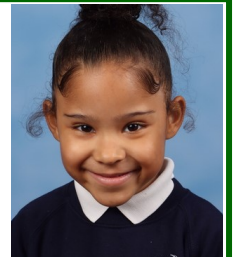
