We have noticed that a number of scooters are being left behind at the end of the school day. Please ensure that your child collects their scooter before leaving the school site. Thank you for your support.

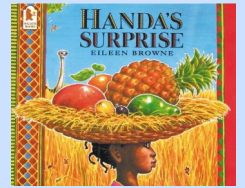

Nursery visit the CLC



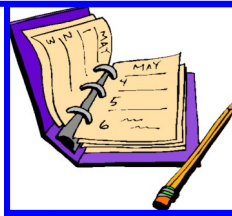
Nursery had a fantastic time visiting the CLC as part of their Computing curriculum, where they enjoyed exploring technology through a range of fun and engaging activities.

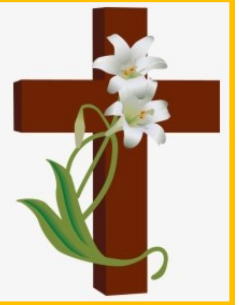

The winner of the Friday newsletter slip prize this week is **Joy** in **Year 2.**

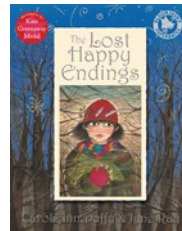
Joy has won a £5 gift voucher to spend in Waterstones.
